“We request your kind reference to Bank’s circular no. CHO/POS/02/2019-20 dated 1.4.2019 wherein the Bank has, inter-alia, declared total 1729 vacancies for promotion from JMGS-I to MMGS-II of which 864 vacancies will be filled up through promotion under merit channel.

Though the Bank has announced the above number of vacancies for promotion, 473 Probationary Officers and 212 Agri. Field Officers across the country who joined the Bank during the month of July, 2016 will not be eligible to compete for promotion as there will be a shortfall of little over 3 months in minimum years of experience requirement as per extant promotion policy of the officers as on the cut off date 1.4.2019. Thus an opportunity missed on account of above said shortfall to sit for promotion test will be a severe blow to their aspiration for career growth in the Bank.

As such, a relaxation of 4 months in the minimum years of experience would enable these young and energetic officers to compete for promotion under merit channel which will make sure that only those who truly merit promotion would come out with flying colours the competition being tough.

We, therefore, request you to kindly consider the matter favourably and allow relaxation of 4 months so that more number of officers become eligible to sit for promotion test under merit channel. We are sure that your act of kind and favourable consideration of the matter will go a long way to motivate the young officers of today.
